It appears the district has been hiring CCA's in droves, as I have been getting tons of new 1187's in the mail, which is good news. Well Monday December 14 open season comes to an end, but keep in mind any CCA's converted to Career, or anyone having a "Qualifying life event" you will be afforded the opportunity to make any needed changes to your Health Benefits Plan. With that in mind you may want to consider filing one of the "Privacy Forms" available at nalchbp.org. These forms are vital should the need arise for a designated individual to have access to your medical records, or represent you in a claim dispute. Designated individuals must 18 years of age. New for 2016 the NALC HBP is rolling out a new "Disease Management Program". Effective January 1, 2016, NALC is introducing a new disease management program called the Personal Health Team at Your Health First. This program allows you to work 1 on 1 with a health advocate on a wide range of conditions to help improve your health. More details on the program will be provided as they become available. Nominations for Shop Steward of the Year

The Shop Steward of the Year Award will be awarded at the Branch Retiree's Banquet. Pew Survey Ranks U.S. Postal Service as Most Favorable Federal Agency

A <u>national poll by the Pew Research Center</u>, released Nov. 23, found the USPS ranked as the most trusted federal agency, with favorable ratings given by 84 percent of those polled. Congress, which has failed repeatedly to heed the Postal Service's request for financial assistance, was at the bottom of the list, with favorable ratings assigned by 27 percent of those polled. Perhaps more encouraging to postal executives was an unusual survey conducted by the University of Maryland for the Initiative. The survey found an "overwhelming majority" of the respondents favored relaxing a requirement of the USPS to "prefund" retiree health benefits.

Penalty Overtime Exclusion

As referenced in Article 8, Sections 4 and 5 of the National Agreement between the NALC and the USPS, the December period during which penalty overtime regulations are not applicable consists of four consecutive service weeks. This year, the December period begins Pay Period 26-15–Week 2 (Dec. 5, 2015) and ends Pay Period 01-16–Week 1 (Jan. 1, 2016).

At the regular monthly meeting of the Branch on Wednesday, November 19th, Larry Adair, a carrier out of our Deptford Office was the winner of the Annual Jack Bittner Thanksgiving Turkey Giveaway. Thanks to Branch Trustee Chairman Jim Comuso for donating this year's turkey.

Update on Cyber Attacks

The recent cyber-attacks against Office of Personnel Management and the U.S. Postal Service data systems remain under investigation. NALC President Rolando has received a letter from OPM's Acting Director advising that postal employees and retirees were affected by the OPM incident. According to OPM, it is highly likely that NALC members were impacted if they underwent a background investigation through

OPM in 2000 or afterwards (which occurs through the submission of forms SF 86, SF 85, or SF85P). Individuals who submitted this information prior to 2000 may be impacted, but it is less likely. OPM has begun notifying impacted individuals beginning in late September and such notifications will continue on a rolling basis. NALC members are encouraged to review available resources on OPM's cyber web site at https://www.opm.gov/cybersecurity/. Individuals may sign up for cybersecurity updates directly on this website. Meanwhile NALC and the other major postal unions are continuing to negotiate over issues arising from the earlier cyber-attack on the Postal Service. Such negotiations are required by the settlement of the unfair labor practice charge against the Postal Service filed by NALC.
