#### **Presidents Report**

There is a change in the air. By now everyone is aware we have a new District Manager, his name is Tim Costello. I Don't know anything about him but I am told he is only in town for approximately 7 weeks. What he is doing here is anyone's guess! As I write this month's article I still haven't gotten any information on what is happening around here. Everyone is either in the dark or is sworn to secrecy! Whatever the case, I am damn sure things are going to start heating up for everyone shortly. I was hoping to have some updated information on the consolidations and the DUO offices when we had our meeting with the former DM, but that has been postponed until such time as another one can be scheduled with the new DM. As soon as I hear something I will let everyone know. All we can do is hang in there until then. We just returned from Atlantic City where the Region 12 training session was held for all of your stewards and officers. It was again very informative and educational. Your stewards picked up a lot of good tools and knowledge to use to protect your rights. National Officer Lew Drass, Director of City Delivery, was in attendance to address the delegation and shared some information about what is happening in our union and what is going on legislatively and contractually. He told us as of February 28, 2011 the memo to continue the JARAP process had expired. As of now we are not sure whether a new memo will be signed or whether management will try a unilateral approach to adjusting our routes. Hopefully by next meeting I will some updated information. He also has asked us to try and sign up as many carriers as we can for COLCPE. If you read last month's Postal Record you will see that our Branch had a dismal showing of contributors. It is important that we participate in this endeavor because like it or not, politics is what we have gotten ourselves involved with as a union. I know we all may have different philosophies and beliefs about how our union spends this money, but the bottom line is we must trust their choices. At least if you give even \$1.00 a pay you can have a voice in how this money is spent. Otherwise, you are just a silent voice. Think about it and let your Steward or Branch officer help you sign up. It is very easy and it will also strengthen our Branch. On to another issue that has bothered me since last month. At last month's meeting I shared an E-mail with those in attendance that was sent by one of the POOM's to all of his Postmasters. I wanted those who weren't there to read what he had to say and let you see how they really feel about us! Here it is exactly as it was sent out;

"Though we normally struggle on Thursdays, before the snow storms we were always still below total DOIS variance as a group. What has occurred throughout the group that we no longer make DOIS variance on Thursdays? I also need to ask the same question for the rest of the week as well. Why are

we not saving as many hours daily like we did before the storms? Need to snap the carriers back into shape."

So, if you were wondering how management really feels about you, look no further than what your postmaster's boss thinks! How this attitude is allowed to continue is an absolute disgrace. The nerve to suggest we were dogging it during these horrendous conditions shows the total disdain they have toward us. All I can say is if they continue to treat us like this, then we are in bad shape as an organization. Why would anyone want to work for an employer who treats his employees like this!

As a remedy the job offer is rescinded. **Westville-** Management did not nave just cause for issuing a 14-Day Suspension for Failure To Follow Instructions/Extending Street Time. As a remedy the 14 day suspension shall be reduced to an official discussion.

**Westville-**Fulltime regular carrier paid 3 hours straight time for work done by PTF.

## **Step B Decisions**

**Bellmawr-**Management did not have just cause to issue letter of warning. As remedy the letter of warning shall be rescinded. **Bellmawr-** Seven day suspension was not the appropriate degree of discipline to issue. As a remedy the seven day suspense shall be reduced to a letter of warning and removed from grievants OPF in six months from date of issue.
