S. 1486 clears Senate committee, 9 to 1

On Feb. 6, the Senate committee with Postal Service oversight, the Homeland Security and Government Affairs Committee, finished its mark-up of the modified Carper-Coburn postal bill, S. 1486, and approved the measure by a vote of 9 to 1. "Unnecessary and damaging attacks on the Postal Service's vital networks and its employees—such as those unfortunately included in S. 1486—would only send the USPS on a downward trajectory," NALC President Fredric Rolando said.

Long-Term Care Insurance

Letter carriers or retired carriers can apply for coverage under the Federal Long Term Care Insurance Program at any time. You do not have to wait until the next Open Season, but you must submit a "full underwriting" application. "Full underwriting," means that applicants will have to answer numerous health-related questions. It may also include a review of medical records and possibly an interview with a nurse. OPM has stated that this is the same level of underwriting that those who purchase individual policies in the private market undergo. Staples' Decision to Close 225 Stores: Further Proof That It's a Bad Idea to Move U.S Post Offices into Staples Stores

Staples announced today that its sales are declining, its earnings are less than expectations, and it will close 225 stores in North America by the end of 2015. "This proves, more than ever," said APWU President Mark Dimondstein, "that it's a bad idea to turn public services over to a private company that can close stores at will, with no public input and no public comment."

Retiree Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA)

There was **no accumulation** toward the 2015 cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs) for both Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS) and Federal Employee Retirement System (FERS) following the Feb. 20 release of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for January 2014.

Load leveling' to more evenly spread Standard Mail Delivery

USPS is implementing new rules designed to revise delivery expectations for some Standard Mail that will result in a more balanced distribution of volume throughout the week. Standard Mail pieces that qualify for the Destination Sectional Center Facility rate generally are delivered in three days. With its new rules, USPS is extending delivery to four days for mail entered Friday or Saturday. USPS says this change will improve delivery efficiency and reduce the traditional heavy Monday workload by spreading the delivery of these Standard Mail pieces across the week. The broadened delivery expectation also benefits customers, since a smaller number of mail pieces delivered each day will more effectively compete for the consumer's attention. Prior to implementing this change, the Postal Service worked with a mail industry workgroup to conduct a test of the load-leveling concept. The test confirmed that extending the delivery date for Standard Mail entered Friday or Saturday helps balance delivery volume during the following week. The new rules will go into effect April 10.
