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Presidents Report

This month I would like to catch everyone up on what is going on in our district. First and foremost, Article 12 has been lifted in the South Jersey and Philadelphia regions effective February 22, 2018 as per the district memo. Hopefully, all of our CCA conversions that have been delayed due to this position of the district, will proceed as quickly as possible as many of our CCA's have been patiently waiting for the district to do their job and get these conversions done. It has been very frustrating to everyone affected at the snail's pace this district is taking to do the right thing. We had to file numerous grievances in order to protect the CCA's conversion dates, since we contend they should have been converted many months ago. I am hopeful the postal service will make the conversion dates accurate to the times the affected CCA's should have made career. I will keep you posted as I hear of conversion dates.

The next issue we have been dealing with is the time-card fraud issue throughout our branch. As everyone is aware, we uncovered many deletions of hours by managers in a few of our offices and grieved those violations and got carriers made whole and also an additional monetary remedy of \$100.00 for these violations. We also were waiting on what kind of "corrective action" the guilty parties would be issued as well for this egregious behavior. The business agent finally received a response from the District Manager James Drummer, which stated the EAS did not document the legitimacy of the changes properly. I am not going to go through the entire response in this forum but can tell you the guilty parties are still managing in this district, which is a disgrace in my opinion. This type of reaction shows me the DM is ticked off that his managers got caught with their hand in his cookie jar and he has to deal with the repercussions.

Speaking of time-card manipulation, we have once again uncovered more of the old nonsense we uncovered in Deptford a few years back. This time we caught the managers in Williamstown putting carriers on 737, 354 and 782 time when in fact they are working on their own routes. From what I have gathered from the TACS record, it appears management is placing carriers who have a customer pick up of parcels on 737 time to lower the route's base time. You may ask why would they do that? The reason is the district manager is bullying all of his offices about making their base times, and one way to get to that number is to hide actual time by putting carrier on nondelivery times. What this does to our route times is lower their average times and opens up fake route evaluations. If you have ever heard of 1840B times, this is the times they use to find an average of your route over a period of time, this is what these manipulations affect. Williamstown is a DUO office that took in a couple different offices and was never given times for those offices that have longer travel times. Instead of going down there and inspecting the office to get accurate route data, they just try and use their old data, which is why they can't possibly make their base times, thus forcing managers to lie about their numbers. Why managers are afraid to stand up to these bullies boggles my mind. I am waiting on a response from the DM on what he plans to do with this information as once again we have caught his minions playing around to appease his threats. What this also tells me is that if they are doing it in Williamstown, they are more than likely doing it in offices who are having trouble making their base numbers. I am sure if the district was really concerned about this style of manipulations, they would just pull all offices 737, 731, 784, 354, etc. reports to expose

how rampant this practice is in this district. My guess is they are the ones behind this creative accounting and have no desire to stop this phony calculating of office numbers. Let's face it, it is all about the DM looking good to his superiors, not doing what is right and giving routes and offices the proper credit for their routes.

One last item regards the latest information on route inspections. We have just finished our Riverton office, where the office came back a little short, but nothing to eliminate more than a portion of the auxiliary route. We shall see how the team wants to approach these results and we will react accordingly. Our Bridgeton office has just finished their 60-day time period of new adjustments, and we are looking over the data to see how accurate they were. It appears there are a few routes that may need to be cut but we are waiting to see how the team will react to fix those affected routes. Hopefully, we can work with the team to get the routes adjusted properly without filing grievances. Finally, the Bellmawr/Gloucester adjustments are still in the beginning stages of their changes, and we will keep you updated on their progress. Hope to see you at this month's meeting.

Executive Vice President, Brain Renfro, was a guest speaker at the seminar and I had the opportunity to convey to him that the stealing of time worked by letter carriers was becoming an epidemic. I went on to suggest to him that the supervisors who committed such an egregious act should be walked out of the building and put on emergency placement just like any other employee who is charged with theft. I also informed him that one of the supervisors who was guilty of committing time fraud in an office of our branch was being promoted. Our Executive Vice President responded that supervisors had been fired for theft in the past and it didn't matter if the people committing the time fraud are promoted, as long as the time fraud is stopped

Health Benefits, MBA, FMLA, Optical

Hello Brothers and Sisters. Just some reminders this month. Any QLE, Qualifying Life Event, allows you to make changes in your health benefits. Such events would be marriage, birth, death, etc...

Also for any CCA's upon conversion to career status; you have a mini open season of 60 days to enroll in the FEHBP, and the health benefit plan of your choice.

The MBA, Mutual Benefits Association, is open year round. I strongly urge everyone to see what benefits are available for you. Possibly an alternative to FEGLI you might look into MBA Life Insurance for a policy that will be paid off by the time you retire. CCA's may want to look into the Retirement Savings available so you have something to show for your time in a non-career status. All funds in this savings can be converted to your TSP upon conversion to career status.

Anyone with a chronic illness/injury, or children in need of parental care are entitled to FMLA upon approval of submitted required documents. Should this need arise simply when calling the Employee call in number request FMLA, and the needed documents will be mailed to you. Once the required form is filled out completely, submitted and approved, you will be protected for your absence under the laws of the Family Medical Leave Act. Any problems with this please give me a call.

All branch 908 members in good standing are entitled to one \$20 optical reimbursement per year per member from the NALC Branch 908 Optical fund. To receive your reimbursement, mail a copy of your receipt to me with your name, and office/retired on it.
