They are starting their nonsense that parcels don't take any extra time. They are once again telling carriers that their 3996's are denied and they have no options in regards to needing assistance. All I can say to this type of management is "really?" How many more times do we have to deal with this type of managing? We have been down this road so many times it makes me sick. All we can do is be professional and do our jobs the proper way. Management cannot deny your request and then tell you that you are not to call. If that occurs, I suggest you come back when they say with the mail you have remaining and get further instructions on what they want you to do with the mail that you told them initially you weren't going to be able to deliver in their projected time. By playing their little childish game you will be protecting yourself from discipline because you are now following their instructions by coming back when they told you. I hope someone wises up and stops treating us like children and have a professional conversation when a carrier request additional time. If there is a disagreement with the numbers then I am sure we can come to a simple solution. I know they don't want to acknowledge the elephant in the room, but it is what it is! Another issue that seems to be surfacing has to deal with our CCA's working on Sundays in our Deptford installation. It seems many CCA's from other offices are being told by their sending offices to work a set amount of hours and when they get to Deptford they are being instructed to work more than that. Scholarships

- 3. The Costas G. Lemonopoulos Scholarship Trust, which awards scholarships to children of NALC members attending Florida state-supported four-year colleges and universities or St. Petersburg Junior College.
