#### **Presidents Report**

As we head into the summer months, I want to update everyone on what is going on now, since there will not be any more newsletters until September. The first issues we are still dealing with are the loaning of our CCA's to other installations. We still do not have an answer from the national on whether or not this loaning is appropriate, so stay tuned for any updates on this issue. I have told all CCA's that once they reach their 60-day period to put in for hold-downs on vacant assignments to at least prevent management from loaning those who are on holddowns. If they pull the CCA's off their opt we can grieve this and hopefully stop them from trying to circumvent this provision. So far, there has not been an issue on this, but it would not surprise me to have them try it to avoid paying SDO overtime. Please let your steward know if you have any problems getting these hold down opportunities. Speaking of SDO overtime, you have probably noticed there is no SDO overtime authorized for any carrier at this time. They are loaning out CCA's to any office that needs to bring someone in on overtime, thus keeping all our OTDL carriers at home. I can understand their thought process since they have an abundant supply of CCA carriers in the district, but if their sole reason is to save the postal service money, how come they continue to pay overtime to all the 204-B's? It is a little hypocritical to say that the only overtime that needs to be cut are the carriers, and not make it across the board! Please do not tell me you cannot find someone to fill in for these people, because that would be a lie! Another issue that has been addressed, finally, is the uniform allowances for our new CCA's. After 90 days, all CCA's will be eligible for uniforms. All former TE's who are now CCA's are eligible immediately and should talk to their local managers to fill out the proper paperwork to get their uniform allowances. I will go in more detail at the regular meeting. If any of you need me to explain it to you please feel free to contact me. One thing all CCA's should be aware of if management loans you to another installation. You can put in for travel expenses since you are being sent to a different installation than the one you are assigned to. They acknowledge this in their own F-15 manual, which states you can be reimbursed for your mileage. I suggest all CCA's to keep track of their mileage and submit form 1164, which you can obtain from your local managers. They are not telling the CCA's this, and it is unfair to ask a CCA to travel 30 miles with no compensation. If management does not cooperate, please see your steward to file a grievance. Another issue that has been resolved deals with FMLA. We can now once again use the NALC- FMLA forms for all of our FMLA needs. They can be found on the NALC website if you need a copy. If anyone has, a problem with this please let me know. That is all I have for now and will update everyone at the regular meeting on all of the latest developments at that time. Hope to see you at the meeting. Please have a safe and healthy summer and hopefully we will have some good news to report on the legislative front when we meet in September.

# Notice of Nominations and Election of Branch Officers, Shop Stewards and Convention Delegates

This is to provide official notice that nominations for the election of Branch Officers, Shop Stewards, and Convention Delegates for the term 2014 thru 2015 shall take place at the regular monthly meeting of the Branch on Wednesday, October 16, 2013. Elections shall be by secret mail ballot of the eligible Branch membership held as soon as possible after nominations at the October regular monthly meeting. Nominations shall be made from the meeting room floor or in writing to the Branch Recording Secretary, mailed, or presented to him/her prior to or at the October regular Branch meeting. Each eligible member of the Branch nominated for office shall accept or reject nomination in writing prior to the adjournment of the October regular monthly Branch meeting. Failure to accept nomination for Branch office prior to adjournment of the October regular Branch meeting will invalidate the nomination. Shop Stewards shall be nominated by an eligible Branch member from the office at which the nominee is employed to represent the Branch membership. Installation of Branch Officers, Shop Stewards, and Convention Delegates shall take place at the regular monthly meeting of the Branch in January. Offices up for election include that of the Branch President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary, Trustees' Chairman, Trustees (4), Health Benefits Representative, Housing Chairperson, Sgt. at Arms, Shop Stewards (25) and approximately (36) Convention Delegates. The number of Convention Delegates to be compensated for their attendance at a State or National Convention, provided they meet the eligibility requirements for such compensation, shall not exceed two and one half (2.5) percent of the total Branch membership, (which is approximately 18).

#### <u>Tips and Snippets</u> <u>Heat Stress Fact Sheet</u>

#### What is heat stress?

When the body is unable to cool itself by sweating, several heat-induced illnesses such as heat cramps, heat exhaustion and the more severe heat stroke can occur.

#### What kind of heat disorders can occur?

**Heat stroke** is the most serious disorder associated with heat stress. It occurs when the body's temperature regulation fails and body temperature rises to critical levels. It is a medical emergency that can lead to death.

**Heat exhaustion** is a result of the combination of excessive heat and dehydration. Untreated, heat exhaustion can lead to heat stroke.

**Heat cramps** are usually the result of hard physical labor in a hot environment, often resulting from an imbalance of electrolytes in the body.

**Heat rashes** are a common problem resulting from persistent wetting of clothing by unevaporated sweat.

#### How am I exposed?

Any process or job site that is likely to raise the worker's deep core temperature raises the risk of heat stress. Operations involving high air temperatures, radiant heat sources,

high humidity, direct physical contact with hot objects, or strenuous physical activities have a high potential for inducing heat stress in employees. In addition, age, weight, degree of physical fitness and acclimatization, dehydration, metabolism, use of alcohol or medications, and a variety of medical conditions all affect a person's sensitivity to heat.

#### What can I do to prevent heat-related conditions?

Heat-related conditions can be prevented or its effects minimized:

- ☐ Acclimatization (Short work exposure early in the hot season, followed by gradual increases in intensity and duration.)
- ☐ Frequent work breaks an area that is cooler than the work environment.
- $\ \square$  Drink plenty of water or non-caffeinated beverages.
- ☐ Wear light-colored, loose-fitting clothing.
- ☐ Avoid all alcohol and caffeine.

The projected accumulation toward the next cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for letter carriers under the 2011-2016 National Agreement is \$374, based on the May 16 release of the April Consumer Price Index (CPI).

The April 2013 Consumer Price Index (CPI) released May 16 showed a slight increase, so the accumulation toward the 2014 retiree cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) now stands at **0.9** percent.

NALC members have access to five scholarship funds to assist them financially in pursuing higher education for themselves or their children:

- 2. The <u>John T. Donelon Scholarship Fund</u>, which each year awards one \$1,000 scholarship, renewable for three consecutive years. Deadline: December 31.
- 3. The <u>Costas G. Lemonopoulos Scholarship Trust</u>, which awards scholarships to children of NALC members attending Florida state-supported four-year colleges and universities or St. Petersburg Junior College. Deadline: June 1.
- 4. The <u>Union Plus Scholarship Program</u>, available to members, spouses and children of NALC and other unions that participate in the AFL-CIO's Union Privilege program.
- 5. The <u>Union Plus National Labor College Scholarship</u>, available to local union leaders to pursue a college degree while continuing to work.

In addition, Union Plus has partnered with Sallie Mae to help parents and students prepare for the world of continuing education.
